- Starting point: earlier work measuring women at RIPE meetings
- Change from CSV output to loading database
- Now we can do ad-hoc queries! Anything is possible!
- But... what to ask?
 - Last X of Y meetings? Impact by country? ...?
- Why am I doing this? What are we trying to change?
